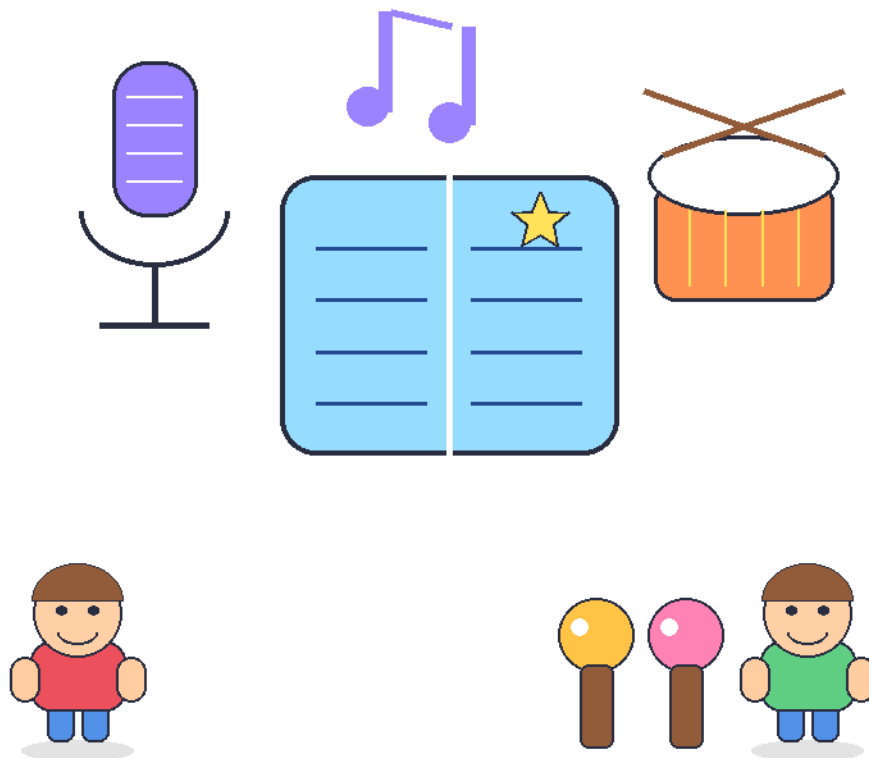


Music and Language Builder Pack

How to Use This Pack

Keep language practice playful



1

Choose one song

Pick a familiar song your child already enjoys.

2

Add one action

Clap, wave, jump, tap, point or use a simple gesture.

3

Pause and wait

Leave space for a sound, look, gesture, clap or word.

4

Celebrate any response

A smile, sound, gesture or word is a communication moment.

Parent note: This pack supports playful language-rich moments. It is not speech therapy or medical advice.

Daily Song Routine

One small song moment at a time



Morning hello song

Words to repeat: hello, up,
wash, clothes

Try for 2 to 5 minutes



Movement song

Words to repeat: jump, clap,
stop, go

Try for 2 to 5 minutes



Snack song

Words to repeat: more, drink,
apple, all done

Try for 2 to 5 minutes



Clean-up song

Words to repeat: tidy, box,
away, finished

Try for 2 to 5 minutes



Story song

Words to repeat: first, next,
then, again

Try for 2 to 5 minutes



Bedtime song

Words to repeat: sleep, night,
cuddle, calm

Try for 2 to 5 minutes

Pause before a familiar word



Choose a song your child knows. Pause before one easy word and wait. If your child does not fill it in, say the word warmly and keep singing.

No pressure rule: If your child does not copy, copy their sound or movement instead.

Pause-and-Wait Reminder

Give your child time to respond



Pause

Stop before a familiar word.



Wait

Count silently to five.



Watch

Look for a sound, smile, gesture or word.



Respond

Copy your child or say the word warmly.



Repeat

Use the same song again another day.



Celebrate

Praise joining in, not perfect speech.

Gentle reminder: Do not force your child to speak. Songs should feel safe, playful and warm.

When to Seek Support

Trust your concern and ask for help



Music can support playful language moments, but it does not replace professional advice. If you are worried about speech, language, understanding, hearing, play or development, speak with a qualified professional.
